

AHS Instrumental Music Highlights

Alpharetta High School opened in the fall of 2004 with 48 students enrolled in the orchestra program and 37 students enrolled in the band program. The current enrollment for entire music program exceeds 500 students.

- Musicians from AHS Orchestra and AHS Band have been selected as Governor's Honors Program Participants for the past fourteen years
- AHS music students have earned placement in the GMEA All-State Organizations every year since opening in 2004

- 2006 – Chamber Orchestra and Wind Ensemble performed in Carnegie Hall for National Band and Orchestra Festival

- 2018 - AHS Orchestra program expands to five levels of orchestra, making it the first of its kind in Fulton County

About the AHS Orchestra Program

The orchestra program at Alpharetta High School has a long standing tradition of excellence. In 2004 the Alpharetta High School Orchestra program began under the leadership of Mr. Sheldon Fisher and quickly gained local, state, and national exposure as a leading high school orchestra program.

The orchestra program offers a course for everyone, consisting of five ability-based levels: Concert Orchestra, Philharmonia, Sinfonia, Symphony, and Chamber. Students are placed into ensembles based on teacher recommendations, past experience, and an audition.

- Students form and rehearse their own ensembles to perform at community and school functions
- All string orchestras combine with band students to form a full symphony orchestra exceeding 200 participants for AHS Graduation every year at Verizon Wireless Amphitheater
- AHS Music Ensembles are consistently rated superior at festivals, competitions, and GMEA Large Group Performance Evaluations

Concert Etiquette

The orchestra students of Alpharetta High School have practiced long and hard to present a quality musical experience for your enjoyment. The audience plays a significant role in the success of each concert. To show appreciation for students' efforts and consideration for your fellow audience members, here are a few suggestions that will help make the concerts an enjoyable experience for everyone.

Dress

The conductor and performers are in formal concert attire. It can also be special for the audience to dress up to attend concerts. This creates a feeling that the concert is something special – because it is!

Entering and Staying Seated

Try to arrive early for concerts. The doors may not always be open as the orchestra is setting up, but you will be rewarded with a good seat for your promptness. Once the music is started, do not get up or try to leave the concert until there is applause. Doing otherwise will disturb the musicians. In addition, the audience may create hazards if the lights are dimmed. The general guideline is to arrive at least 5 or 10 minutes ahead the performance time, get a program, and find a comfortable seat. Conversation with your fellow concertgoers is appropriate at this time, however all discussions should cease as soon as the lights dim and musicians start arriving on stage.

Quiet please!

There are some musical pieces that are so delicate that even quiet whispering, rustling programs, and opening candy wrappers can ruin the experience for those around you. Please be considerate. In addition:

- Please turn off cellular phones, and be sure to silence all other electronic devices
- Please do not take flash photography. This is not only distracting to the audience, but disruptive to the performers.
- No talking during performances. Your voice can be picked up by the audio recording equipment and is discouraging to fellow audience members.
- Refrain from calling out your student's name. Younger children may be inclined to try to get the attention of older siblings. Again, this is a concert and not a sporting event.

The orchestra welcomes younger children to their concert with the hope they may be inspired to learn, appreciate, and study music. However, at times the music can be startling, the concert program can go long, or the seats may become uncomfortable, causing your child to become restless. Please remove crying, fidgety children from the auditorium as quickly and quietly as possible.

Showing appreciation

It is appropriate to clap at the entrance of the concertmaster/mistress and then again for the conductor. Sometimes the orchestra will play several movements within a composition, and this will be listed in the program. It is best not to clap between movements in order to sustain the mood and momentum of the piece. If you are unsure of when clapping is appropriate, observe the conductor. Also, note that the conductor may pause slightly at the end. It is his way of

The Director

Dr. Charles Laux

Dr. Charles Laux is the Director of Orchestras at Alpharetta High School where his duties include directing five levels of orchestra, including the nationally recognized AHS Symphony Orchestra. He also serves as Essential Elements clinician, consultant, and contributor for the Hal Leonard Corporation. Additionally he is an endorsed artist/educator and clinician for D'Addario Orchestral Strings and Eastman Stringed Instruments. Dr. Laux holds degrees in music education from Ohio University, the University of Nevada – Las Vegas, and a Ph.D. from The Ohio State University, with a minor in educational technology.



From 2012 to 2016, Dr. Laux served as Assistant Professor of String Music Education at Kennesaw State University near Atlanta, Georgia. At KSU, his responsibilities included string teacher training. He taught courses in string techniques and pedagogy, instrumental methods, and music education technology. He also supervised student teachers, conducted the KSU Philharmonic, coordinated string outreach, and served as director of the KSU String Project and Summer Music Intensive. Under his leadership, the KSU String Project grew to provide group after school lessons to over 100 students taught by 14 undergraduate music education majors.

Prior to his relocation to Georgia, Dr. Laux spent fifteen years as a public school orchestra director in the states of Nevada, Florida, and Ohio. Under his direction in 2006, the Winter Park High School Philharmonic (Florida) was selected to perform at the prestigious Midwest Band and Orchestra Clinic in Chicago.

Dr. Laux served as a graduate teaching associate in strings and full-time Ph.D. student in residence at The Ohio State University under the supervision of world-renowned string pedagogue and researcher, Dr. Robert Gillespie. His teaching duties included teaching string methods and string technique labs for music education majors, supervising student teachers, and serving as assistant conductor for the Columbus Symphony Youth Orchestra Chamber Strings.

In addition to public school teaching, Dr. Laux was an adjunct faculty member for twelve years at the collegiate level, having taught music appreciation courses and applied string lessons at the College of Southern Nevada and Valencia College (Orlando, FL). He has also served as an adjunct faculty member at The University of Nevada, Las Vegas where he taught string instrument methods.

Dr. Laux's leadership roles include serving as president of the Nevada and Florida chapters of the American String Teacher's Association (ASTA) and as the southern division representative on the NAFME Council for Orchestral Education.

A dynamic presenter, Dr. Laux completed over 100 educational sessions at conferences in 22 states, and at many national conferences. He has conducted regional orchestras in Florida, Georgia, Ohio, New Mexico, and South Carolina. His state-level appearances include the 2012 New Mexico All-State Concert Orchestra, the 2013 Georgia Statewide Honor Orchestra, and the South Carolina Middle School All-State Orchestra in 2016. He will conduct the West Virginia MS All-State Orchestra in 2018.

Dr. Laux has performed with the Las Vegas Philharmonic, the Nevada Chamber Symphony, and several other orchestral ensembles. In 2016, he performed as a soloist, collaborating with several members of the Atlanta Symphony Orchestra. Dr. Laux remains in frequent demand across the nation as a presenter, orchestra clinician, conductor, and adjudicator. He resides in Marietta with his two sons, Charlie (9) and Anderson (7).


